PROGRAM OVERVIEW

- □ Weatherization of homes for income-qualified residents with the aid of federal, state and utility grants.
- □ In most cases for income-qualified residents, weatherization is provided at no cost
- Our goals are to improve the energy efficiency, safety, comfort and durability of people's homes





ELIGIBILITY

- □ Live in Washington County
- In most cases, at or below200% Federal Poverty Level
- Own or rent your home
- Single family home, duplex, tri-plex or four-plex

Income-qualified residents receive services at no cost!



WAIT LIST

- □ Once approved, clients are placed on a wait list. Current wait time is low.
- □ Wait time depends on heat source, funding, priority and number of applicants.
- □ Priority given to:
 - □ Persons 60 years or older
 - □ Persons with disabilities
 - Veterans
 - □ Households with a high energy burden
 - □ Households with children 18 or younger





WHAT WE DO

- EDUCATION: We provide information and items, like LEDs and smoke alarms.
- AUDIT: We test the home to determine any possible cost-effective measures.





- □ INSTALLATION: We hire licensed contractors to install the measures.
- □ INSPECTION: We re-test the home after the measures are installed.



HEALTHY HOMES

- Poorly sealed homes allow pests, moisture, radon and pollutants to enter
- Poor insulation leads to drafts and extreme temperatures, both hot and cold
- Faulty combustion devices degrade indoor air quality and may be deadly

- Insulation
- □ Air/Duct Sealing
- Ventilation
- Heating System
- Windows
- Refrigerator
- Water Heater
- □ EPDM Roof
